It was a bit disappointing that in the end only three Masters Games entries were from the eastern states. But they came for a good time and entered every event they possible could. It meant a few more events didn't have to be cancelled due to their low number of entries. Like the 25m Air Rifle Benchrest that I hadn't seen being shot before. But it was part of last year's Nationals in Shepparton. Supported Air Rifle that has been in the Nationals for a few years now. But I haven't taken too much interest because in WA we haven't been shooting any air rifle.

In the next couple of months there is still lots more shooting with three big competitions. Two days of shooting at Kalamunda Open on 50m paper targets. Followed by the two days of Subiaco Open over the June long weekend. It has paper targets for 20m and 90m with 50m electronic targets. Then my old club Post-Tels Open with just the 20m and 90m ranges. Hope everyone can come to at least one of these competitions.

And I would be in real trouble with Regina if I didn't remind anyone who hasn't already entered our State Postal Championships. You can still enter them and just need to shoot all matches before September. She will really appreciate your participation.

# AUSTRALIAN MASTERS GAMES

## RESULTS—PERTH 2022

The 18th Australian Masters Games (AMG) was recently hosted by Perth after all the COVID border and social distancing issues caused a six month delay. Smallbore was the only shooting done in these Games. It was one of about thirty sports held of the original 52 who were originally part of these Masters Games. Our 31 competitors were understandably lower than recent Games. But it gave three days of close competition in eleven events held on our Whiteman Park HQ 10m, 20m, 50m and 90m ranges.

Masters Games entries are restricted to TRA members aged over 30. In each event age of a competitor is used to group them, instead of their shooting average which is typically used to determine a grade or division.

It was critical that WASRA Members supported the Masters Games by entering events. Of the original nineteen events, eight were cancelled due to lack of entries. The eleven events that were held was because of entries by WASRA Members. Also appreciated was a high number of events entered by our three competitors from the east, Queensland, NSW and Victoria which were important for some events to be held.

Some very close results were achieved, especially in the bigger Open Benchrest class events with Maureen Edwards achieving a clean sweep of all three ranges. While in Sporter Benchrest and Prone classes the Gold Medal winners were shared around a bit more across those ranges.

I am sure there are some happy competitors who were good enough to be awarded one of those big beautiful Australian Masters Games medals in their age category in at least one of the events.

COVID impacted our plans for presentation of medals. It was great Heather Henderson, retired Mayor of Subiaco and long-time support of shooting was able to help us. But circumstance gave us an opportunity to acknowledge as our Presenters some well respected members like Terry Gordon, Regina Masters, Ron Harrington and current President Peter Hug.

WASRA is also very fortunate to have members who are very supportive and were prepared to help as volunteer to conduct these events for the nineteenth Australian Masters Games. It's only the second time that Perth has hosted them. The first time was in 1993, just after WASRA had finished its move into the new Harrison Range on Swanbourne our HQ for more than 20 years.

The AMG Management ensured many critical tasks needed in the preparation for our events got done, even if there were several attempts for some of them caused by COVID uncertainty and delays. Also disrupted was formal registration of the many volunteers needed to conduct our shooting. But that didn't stop them from helping to get all the things needed to prepared and run our events. For everyone it was all a good test run at all levels for when WASRA hosts the TRA National Championships next Easter.

WASRA extends a big thank you to everyone who volunteered as a Range Officials, scorer, with target preparation, presentations, canteen, child minding, lawn mowing or our daily range cleaning of our facilities. Everything that was needed to done for our event got done.

It was a great learning experience for everyone about how our new range facilities can provide everything needed by these bigger occasions. Whenever a solution was required in response to an issue it was dealt with by willing help. This always makes for good experience. The kind and congratulatory words given at the end of the event by Queensland's Ian Appleby on behalf of travelling competitors acknowledged the friendly, helpful support they received during their events.

To all our competitors your generally calm and cooperative participation and in some instances patience was much appreciated. There were some events where some things were unfamiliar to either or both competitors and/or organisers. It was clear by the end of these events there had been no show stopping outcomes. Even more importantly a great deal of learning and experience had been achieved from them by both the competitors and those managing competitions.
