# 2023 TRA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Whiteman Park HQ Ranges 4<sup>th</sup>—10<sup>th</sup> April

WASRA will host its first TRA National Championships on our Whiteman Park ranges. Every one of you will be able to help us in some way to make it as good as last year's Master Games.

Your support is needed by entering events or being part of our volunteer team to provide all the services needed to help make it a typical West Australian friendly event.

The last time WASRA hosted a Nationals was in 2012 on our previous home for nearly 50 years, Harrison Range in Swanbourne. So to most members being involved with a big event like these TRA Nationals will be a very new experience. Seeing our Whiteman Park electronic targets being used like they should be for ISSF competitions will also surprise some of you even more. Hopefully this will encourage many of you to want to come as a competitor or contribute as a volunteer or both during the Championships.

None of us have any experience on our Whiteman Park Range with doing all the many tasks involved with running a Nationals. A few Members, who have been involved with other Nationals down at Harrison Range, our 2022 Masters Games or ISSF events in the east will have some idea what is needed. But it will be critical to us successfully running our Nationals for them to get lots of help from novice volunteers. Some Members have completed L1 and L2 Range Officer courses to help with important range duties. A bit later in this Newsletter there is more detail.

This year's Championships here in Perth will have a full program of sixteen events. Shooting Australia our peak national body has classified some events as Tier 1 for use with choosing Australian International rifle teams. We have also been allowed to include for the very first time our very popular F Class match as a demonstration event.

Experience of shooting in a National Championship will be rare for Members who have joined WASRA in the last decade. Normally by now many would have accepted the challenge and travelled in a WA team to a TRA Nationals held in another State. But it hasn't really been possible.

Firstly because WASRA's first attempt in 2019 to host our Nationals was cancelled because it could not get last minute approval from WAPOL to use our new air rifle range. This was then followed by three years of uncertainty of COVID 19's disruptions. So you are encourage to come and be part of our Nationals on as many days as possible if not as a competitor or volunteer to at least experience and enjoy seeing smallbore rifle shooting being shot by Australia's best young and not so young elite shooters.

Most events will not use our normal whole ring/integer scoring normally used in WA competitions. Instead the ISSF decimal scoring is used. Many events will be shot to full ISSF rules and times but still using our some familiar rifles. There will also be some events decided by the top eight shooters in exciting knockout finals. Something new for most of you where those competition medal winners will be determine by just a few decimal points.

Most of the more popular and familiar events will include Graded medals and awards. A competitor's TRA Grade is also determined by an average score but may not be the same as the Grade set by our State Competitions Committee. This is because there is a slight difference in averages used for our State and the new National grades.

TRA web site home page [www.tra.org.au](http://www.tra.org.au) has links to our Entry Form and Championship Information Flyer. Both are pdfs to download and get a full program of events and lots more detail about conditions and conduct of each event including TRA grading scales.

Our Entry Forms and Flyer are also on the Whiteman Park Clubroom bench along with a big gold deposit box for anyone to put in completed Entry Form but not any payment. That can be done later.

As part of the Nationals there will be two main social events that everyone, including family and friends are invited to come and enjoy. On Saturday night will be a BBQ. Then a Trophy Presentation Dinner will be held on Monday night .

Hope to see you on the range during the Nationals.

## ALAN WILLIAMS

Alan Williams passed away suddenly in hospital on Wednesday morning 5th October 2022.

In Alan's first 20 years of shooting was as a member of Doubleview Club until 1999. He had many National successes in both 3 Position and Prone events. Over those years he was well known for his devotion to improving his results. In 1994 he became our first West Australian rimfire rifle shooter selected in a Commonwealth Games Smallbore Rifle Team. He left our sport for a while when passion for rifle shooting was lost because health issues interrupted it.

In 2019 he joined Subiaco Club after feeling more comfortable about dealing with his health challenges and also saw the potential of our new range. It didn't take him long to show everyone that he could still shoot to a very high standard. But the reason many WASRA members will remember Alan would not be these wins in competitions.

If he wasn't standing as a Range Officer on any club night it was usually because he was behind a young or not so young shooter, both who may have asked him for some help. There are other members who will have a valuable memento from Alan with their very personalised breach flag that he made them. A few of us will also enjoy many fond memories of Alan as he challenged and debated so many aspects of our rifles, equipment and sport's development.

But everyone who came to a Tuesday practise on Whiteman range for his last year will remember him for every week preparing a delicious BBQ lunch for everyone. His tireless commitment and effort he put into to preparing them was always appreciated. The day before his death it was to be his final contribution for us. Despite not feeling well on the day he ensure everything was prepared for everyone to enjoy before letting someone take him off to hospital.

Our sport will long remember Alan's contribution as a very successful West Australian competitor, and good effective Range Officer and respected coach. But most of it was all done the unassuming Alan Williams way.

A contribution that is going to be sadly missed

# REVISED—TRA 2023 ONLINE COMPETITION SERIES

For both Individuals and State Teams

TRA is running its online series again in 2023. This year will be shot over 10 rounds on dates shown in WASRA's Events Calendar that include new 25m RBA, 50m RBA, 20m Prone and 20m Benchrest.

## 1. Disciplines

Separate competitions for each discipline on either Decimal –Electronic target or Integer (Ring)–Paper targets

# Only one score on either electronic or paper can be submitted

- Dates of the 10 rounds can be found in WASRA's calendar of events inside the newsletter cover.
- Each round must be shot over the scheduled week.
- Matches must be supervised/witnessed by an appropriate qualified person.
- ISSF and TRA Supplementary Rules apply.
- The Supervisor must enter scores into the scoring system by the due date and time.
- Targets and score sheets must be retained until the competition is complete.
- Random check of targets may be undertaken during the course of the competition.
- There is no entry fee for this competition. But local range fees may be payable. This will depend on where each athlete is shooting.

## 10. Awards

### Individual:

There will be 3 individual categories in each discipline:

- Open (including men, women, WSPS)
- Junior under 21 (including men, women, WSPS as per ISSF rules)
- Junior under 18 (including men, women, WSPS as per ISSF rules)

Individual's results for the series will be the sum of their top 3 scores throughout the series.

### State Teams:

This will be based on the sum of the best 3 scores (as per the individual competition) for the top 3 athletes from each State in each series.

## 11. Notes

TRA acknowledges that the requirements will preclude or make it difficult for some locations/athletes to compete in every round.

However, with only 3 scores needed to register a result, hopefully most people can make it to their closest suitable range at least 3 events of the 10 series throughout the year
